2017 Annual Lecture and AGM

The 2017 Annual Lecture will be given by The Very Reverend Dr David Ison, Dean of St Paul's.

The lecture and the Annual General Meeting of Inclusive Church will take place on **Thursday 20th July 2017** in the OBE Chapel, in the crypt of St Paul's Cathedral.

David Ison's title for the lecture is: *"Including the Exclsuive: how liberal can you be?"*

David Ison trained for ordination at St John's College, Nottingham. He served his title at St Nicholas and St Luke Deptford in the diocese of Southwark from 1979 to 1985, while also writing a PhD in church history at King's College, London to develop skills to work in training people for ministry. From 1985 to 1988 he was Lecturer at the Church Army Training College in Blackheath. In 1988 he became Vicar at Potters Green in the diocese of Coventry, where he worked to physically and spiritually rebuild the church. In 1993 he moved to Exeter as Diocesan Continuing Ministerial Education Officer to take on a variety of roles in training and supporting clergy in their ministry, and in 1995 also became a Residentiary Canon at Exeter Cathedral. David became Dean of Bradford in 2005, prior to his appointment at St Paul's. David is a member of General Synod.

His interests include history and current affairs, interfaith relations, DIY and scuba diving; and he drives a kit-car he made himself.
